

The late Holy Father, Saint John Paul II, decreed that the second Sunday of Easter should be designated Divine Mercy Sunday. The feast is predicated on the visionary experiences of a Polish Sister Faustina Kowalska (Congregation of the Sisters of Mercy). Her visions emphasized the Lord Jesus is the very embodiment of Divine Mercy. In some ways the resulting devotions bear a resemblance to the those of Sister Mary Margaret Alacoque (Visitation Sisters) in 16th century France. Sister Margaret Mary's experiences resulted in the Devotions to the Sacred Heart of Jesus. Both devotions developed at points in the Church's history during which we were losing a sense of God's merciful love extended to us.

In the older iconography of the Sacred Heart, Jesus is pictured with His heart revealed and on fire with "blazing love for us". In Sister Faustina's visions, Jesus is shown with rays of merciful love extended from His outstretched and welcoming hands. Both visionary experiences in their distinct ways, exist to illustrate the love that God has for us. Jesus is the human icon of that love. Every miracle He worked, every sign He performed, every compassionate word He spoke were signs of God's s love to us.

Despite their many styles the entire corpus of books of Old Testament had one common theme: God's loves His people and wish to bestow life on them. For Christians that divine impulse was Incarnated (enfleshed) in the life, death and resurrection of Jesus of Nazareth. God's very Word, God's own self Communication, is plunged into our history so that we might share the divine life. This indeed is Divine Mercy. God had no need to do this but in St. John's Gospel, the Evangelist repeatedly declares: God is love. The powers of death and darkness do not prevail because God loves us.

If Jesus' story ended on Good Friday, it would be the tragic narrative of another good, fine, person crushed by the powers of infamy. Strong as those powers are, they do not prevail. The God of life does prevail. Even though we know that biologically the heart is fundamentally a pump that keeps our blood circulating throughout our bodies, it has for time immemorial been the icon of love. The blazing Heart of Jesus was the symbol of God's burning love for each of us. Similarly the rays extended from the Jesus of Sister Faustina's visions also denote God's merciful love extended to us. The Easter season is the irrevocable commitment of God " to give us life, and life to the full". Identified with Jesus at Baptism, we are destined to share life with Him. That's God's plan and only we can frustrate it if we deliberately stray from the path He has set out for us.
