Dear Parishioners;

This Sunday's Gospel always strikes me as a little unfair but like all the parables, it was meant to gain our attention. If the apparent unfairness alerts us, then so much the better! The parable describes a wealthy man going on a journey. Before leaving he entrusts his possessions to his servants. He gives each man a portion of his money according to each servant's ability. This seems to imply that he wishes the servants to do something with that money. Oddly enough in English the word "talent" has come to mean: "ability". The original meaning was a terrifically large sum of money - the change in meaning probably resulted from this parable. We are familiar with what happens. Two of the servants invest the money in commerce and they double the amounts given to them. The third servant digs a hole and hides the money in it.

After a long period the master (the word in the original Greek is "kyrios" - the same word also translates as "lord") returns and he settles accounts with the three servants. The first two are highly praised. Because the master is impressed with their initiative they are given even greater responsibilities. By contrast the third servant is roundly condemned. It is important to remember that the third servant did not do anything wrong or dishonest. He did not squander the money nor did he lose it. But he was condemned because he did nothing! The original amount was given back intact. From the dialogue we can deduce that the servants recognize that their master is a demanding person; moreover, they were expected to know his intentions.

The first two servants, though not on the same level of ability, (one received a larger number of talents than the other) have both gained their master's praise. They are told to "come and share your master's joy". Not so the third servant, he will miss sharing his master's joy because fearfully he views the master only as a harsh man. He does not view the master as a person, who wishes to share his responsibilities and joy with him. Rather he hides what is given to him.

Once again the theme of the Gospel is preparedness. Like the wise virgins in last week's Gospel, these servants are expected to do what they must in order to await their master's return. The amounts of money entrusted to them do symbolize the gifts and talents we receive and that we are expected to use in order to build up the kingdom. The talents are our acts of compassion, sensitivity, kindness and generosity. Like any "talent"; if we do not exercise it, then we stand the chance of losing it. This accounts for the apparently unfair last words of the Gospel: "For to everyone who has, more will be given and he will grow rich; but from the one who has not, even what he has will be taken away." The exercise of our talents prepares us for the coming of the Master (the Lord) be it at the end of our sojourn here or at His final appearance on the Last Day.

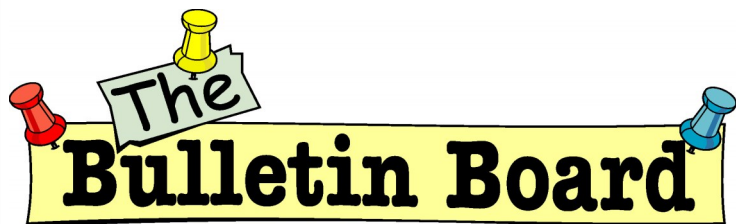
