Dear Parishioners:

The Sunday Gospel finds Jesus in a discussion with the Pharisees. Previously He had confounded the Sadducees, who neither believed in a spiritual dimension nor an afterlife. Jesus and the Pharisees believed in both. This group of Pharisees are probably very well disposed toward Jesus. They certainly approved of His teachings, but they may have pondered: "Who gave Him the authority to teach like this?" Possibly with this in mind, one of the Pharisees decided to prove Jesus' authority by testing Him.

At our Lord's time Jewish scholars acknowledged over 600 hundred laws or rules which attempted to govern every aspect of Jewish life. These "commandments" had their origin in the Ten Commandments so the observant Jewish man or woman was expected to fulfill them. There were regular debates about which Laws were the most important. The question of the Pharisee in today's Gospel may have been a sincere attempt to discover Jesus' thinking on the matter.

Cleverly Jesus combines two mandates from the Torah. The first is from the "Shema", the prayer still said twice daily by observant Jews. The prayer reads: "Sh'ma Yisra'eil, Adonai Eloheinu, Adonai echad." "Hear O Israel, the Lord is our God, the Lord alone." It continues:"...and you shall love the Lord, with all your soul and with all you might...". Jesus adds:"...and with all your mind." To this the Lord also combines a command from the Book of Leviticus (19:18): "You shall love your neighbor as yourself." The Pharisaic scholar had asked which commandment was the greatest. In response Jesus has combined two and connected them intimately. These two encompass the Law and the prophets, a short hand expression indicating the totality of the Old Testament. Many of the teachings of the New Testament will expand upon the notion of who is the "neighbor". The neighbor is not simply the proximate person or member of the same group but includes all those who require our help or assistance.

Several words in the New Testament are commonly translated into English as "love". To complicate matters further, the word "love" is often misused in English. "I love your new shirt" is incorrect since a shirt is an inanimate object. Love implies reciprocity. It should be: "I <u>like</u> your new shirt". The type of love to which Jesus refers is an active concern for all other people - a desire to bring about the good for each person. Depending on circumstances, this may or may not involve my emotions. For example many of our Sunday second collections are taken for various charitable organizations. We may never know the recipients of our generosity but we desire or will the best for them. Of course we also want the best for our families and friends and normally that would also involve an emotional attachment to them. We cannot possibly love on the same emotional level the six billion other occupants of this planet. But, we certainly can desire to bring about the best for them and, when possible, work toward that end.

In the two greatest commandments, Jesus summed up all the others. For example, the first reading from the Book of Exodus, the second book of the Bible, is a good illustration of what the Law of Love includes - business considerations must never take precedence over people's survival.

By fulfilling the two greatest commandments we fulfill the mandates of the Law.


