### Reflection for The Epiphany of the Lord

In the eastern Church, both Catholic and Orthodox, Epiphany has almost the same significance as Christmas. The Greek word "epiphany" means a "showing forth" - a presentation. That's what we celebrate this Sunday. The Lord Jesus is revealed to the nations, which are represented by the Magi (or Three Kings or Wise Men). In Spain, Latin America and other countries, gifts are shared on Epiphany as a remembrance of the gifts brought to the Child Jesus by the Wise Men. The Wise Men are often called "kings" because of the types of gifts they carried, especially gold which is always linked with royalty. St. Matthew's Gospel does not inform us of the number of wise men but again we assume that there were three, because there were three gifts.

There was not too much information given in Scripture about the Magi from the east. Traditionally they are named Melchior, Caspar, and Balthazar. It is most likely that they came from Persia since the word "magi" is of Persian origin. It is also the root word of the English word "magic". The word "magi" referred to a class of priests or astrologers. This last option seems plausible since they were interested in the stars. Their special star could be explained by a natural phenomenon such as a comet, the alignment of planets, or a nova, all of which were recorded near the time of Jesus' birth. However, it also could be supernatural. Regardless of its origin, it is clear that God used the star to make evident the great event of Jesus' birth.

It was common in the ancient world to view a special star as a signal of the birth of a king, so it makes sense that the Magi were looking for the king of the Jews. The news of Jesus' birth troubled Herod the Great because he was the king of the Jews, appointed as such by Rome. Herod was a power-hungry ruler who had no problem eliminating anyone who threatened his rule, even his own family members. The news from the Magi came as a threat to his power and thus he deceptively sent them to find Jesus' location in order to kill Him. Yet, the Magi went to venerate the Child.

The fact that Gentiles came to worship the Messiah is evidence that Jesus came for all of humanity. The expensive gifts of gold, frankincense, and myrrh were only fit for a king. They also indicate Jesus' humanity. Gold was a metal commonly associated with kings. Jesus is a king. Frankincense was an aromatic spice used in divine worship. Jesus is God. Myrrh was used to preserve the bodies of the dead. Jesus is human and like all humans He will die. Jesus is Emmanuel (God with us).

The Magi represent all those who seek and pursue the truth. Since they represent all of humanity, in art the three Magi are often pictured as members of the major human groupings.

The Magi's return by another way symbolically represents that whenever we encounter Jesus, we will never remain the same.
