

Dear Parishioners;

Again this Sunday, the Gospel is drawn from Jesus' very long dialogue on the Eucharist as found in St. John's Gospel. Oddly in his narrative of the Last Supper, John does not include the words of Institution ("This is My Body...this is my Blood of the new covenant") rather he characterizes the type of service to be rendered by those who are followers of Christ. It is John alone who includes the scene of Our Lord humbly washing the feet of the disciples, a task usually assigned to the person with the lowest status in a household. "I have given you an example, so that you also must do."

John uses the image of the vine and the branches as a metaphor of our union with and reliance on Jesus. In this week's citation, Jesus builds on the ancient tradition of the manna given by God though Moses to the Hebrews in their desert wandering. Typical of St. John, Jesus is misunderstood by His listeners: "How can this man give us his flesh to eat?" A repulsive notion to His listeners! But Jesus has given a hint of the manner in which this will be accomplished by His constant references to "I am the living bread come down from heaven ...whoever eats this bread will live forever...the bread I will give is my flesh for the world." Jesus goes on to assure His disciples that just as He has life that flows from the Father, His followers "who feed on Me, will have life because of Me...whoever eats this bread will live forever".

John is preparing us for the gift of the Eucharist. Under the appearances of two very simple foodstuffs: unleavened bread and a cup of wine, Jesus in His Risen nature will be present. Just as these two food staples underlie most meals in the Mediterranean world (both then and now!) and sustain natural life: the Bread and Wine of the Eucharistic meal will lead to eternal life. As with regular food, what we eat becomes us and in a manner of speaking we become it. The ordinary brings about the extraordinary.

The worthy reception of Holy Communion requires a determination to become like Him, Whom we have consumed under the simple appearances of bread and wine. The Gospels are filled with examples of how that is to be accomplished. As mentioned: "I have given you an example so you also must do." (John 13: 1-20). We are to be transformed to be more and more like Christ, Who is present in a special way at this sacred meal.

Following on this, before the liturgical changes originating in the Second Vatican Council, the priest concluded Mass with the Latin words: "Ite, missa est!" Often inadequately translated as "Go, the Mass is ended." it in fact meant: "Go, you are sent!" That sending was so important, that eventually it gave its name to the rest of the Eucharistic celebration. Mass or "misa" in the Romance languages, comes directly from that dismissal. "Go, you are sent!" Strengthened now by the twin gifts of the Word, proclaimed at Mass, and then a worthy reception of the Lord in Holy Communion, we are sent to bring the Good News out into the world.
