Dear Parishioners,

A Catholic magazine once published a very interesting story where a man who, in his childhood, was suffering from curvature of the spine. The man mentions that as a small child he suffered mentally because he had a crooked back. His deformity was not so noticeable when he was dressed. But when it came time to take off his shirt, his back looked horrible. This caused him to begin to hate his disability.

In the school, which he attended, periodic medical examinations were carried out. Standing in the line to see the doctor, the boy trembled with fear and shame at the thought of the doctor seeing his deformed back. Finally, his time came to see the doctor. The boy's hands were shaking with nerves and shame as he pulled off his shirt. The doctor looked at him for a moment, then did something unusual. He stepped out from behind his desk, walked over to the shuddering boy, wrapped his hands around his face, looked him in the eye, and asked: "Son - do you believe in God?" "Yes, sir," answered the boy. "That's good," the doctor said. The more that you believe in God, the easier it will be to accept yourself.

After these words, the doctor returned to his desk, wrote a note on the boy's card, and then left his office for a moment. After leaving the doctor, the boy with his heart trembling looked at the note the doctor had just written, expecting the worst. He could not believe his eyes when he read about himself: "This boy has an extremely noble-shaped head." After a while the doctor returned, ran a few other routine tests. At the end, he said with a smile: "it's all right. You can dress up now. And send in the next boy." This short episode in the boy's life had a profound effect on his entire future. This boy never forgot the doctor's words which greatly lifted his spirit.

This story beautifully reflects the words of Christ in today's Gospel:

"Come to me, all you who labor and are burdened, and I will give you rest.

Take my yoke upon you and learn from me, for I am meek and humble of heart; and you will find rest for yourselves."

Gentleness, humility, love, these are not values that are too popular in the modern world. More popular today are: pride, inferiority, violence, scandal and evil. Examples of these traits are found on our streets, in newspaper columns, on the screens of our cinemas and on televisions. The more so that these traits are present, the more so that we must remember Christ's words:

"learn from me, for I am meek and humble of heart;"

Our Savior not only instructed us to be gentle in dealing with people, but he himself gave us an example of understanding and gentleness. We see the example of an adulteress woman. The Pharisees brought her to the Lord Jesus so he could judge her actions. Christ showed great gentleness not only to this sinful woman, but also to those; Who accused her. He did not shout, he did not wave his hands. He just bent down and began to write in the sand.

The Lord Jesus also teaches us to be understanding and gentle towards other people in the parable of the lost sheep. In the story the Good Shepherd does not beat the lost sheep for being lost, instead he only takes her gently on his shoulders and carries her to the fold

Christ also wants us to imitate the gentleness and goodness of the father in the parable of the prodigal son. This good father, symbolizing our Heavenly Father, does not condemn his son who has left his home and has squandered his fortune by living lavishly. He does not shout at him when he comes home, instead he only opens his arms and presses his son to his heart.

Delicacy and the ability to understand the imperfection and weakness of another person, can do real miracles and transform a human life, just as the boy's life was transformed thanks to the goodness and delicacy of a wise physician.

Let us take with us these words:

"learn from me, for I am meek and humble of heart;"

let us first of all be indulgent for human misery and weakness, because we ourselves are weak and sinful. Let's help as well as we can with other people and treat them with delicacy and love.
