Dear Parishioners,

Today's Gospel presents us with an example of how the followers of Jesus are to behave. The disciples have been travelling with Jesus in an area north of Galilee and He has asked them "who do you say that I am?" Obviously He is not a royal Messiah in the usual sense of the word. Peter has described Him as the "Christ" (the anointed one - the Greek translation of Messiah), a loaded term with many implications at that time. Jesus indicates that the Son of Man (the title that He seems to prefer) must suffer and die at the hands of His enemies and then rise. The apostles had no understanding of what this meant and certainly a "suffering and dying" Messiah did not enter into their thinking.

When they return from the north, Jesus asks them what they were discussing on the way - only to discover that despite everything He has told them, they have been discussing, "who was the greatest" among them. In contrast, Jesus informs them that the greatest must be the one who serves the others. His illustration of this might strike us as odd. We live in a world in which everyone strives to stay young or look young. In the ancient world the drive was just the opposite: to attain old age. This is reflected in some of our English words. Senate, for instance, is from the Latin word "senax" and it means an elderly person. Senates were originally the gatherings of the elders, who were assumed to have attained the wisdom needed to govern. Jesus illustrates His point with a small child. A small child in ancient society was a "nobody". Especially in terms of the high child mortality rates - a small child was of little social consequence and was dependent on everyone else. The goal of ancient society was to survive childhood and become an adult. Yet Jesus says: anyone receiving this child in His name, receives Him and consequently the One Who sent Him (God the Father).

By receiving the humblest member of society, Jesus is received and so is the Father. A small child becomes an icon of a God, Who humbled Himself to be one with us so that we might enter a loving relationship with Him. Generally small children are free of the ambition, greed and disagreements that often tear adult society. By receiving a small child, Jesus indicates that as adults - we are meant to be like the God, Whose icon is that small child.

Last Tuesday the media announced that the Diocese of Brooklyn had entered into an agreement that provided a very large monetary settlement with four men, who as children, had been abused by a volunteer in a Brooklyn parish, which is now closed. The Bishop assured his priests at a meeting last Monday that the funding for this settlement was not from your contributions nor from either the *Generation of Faith Campaign* or the *Annual Catholic Appeal*. Those campaigns will continue to support various Diocesan ministries as well as our parishes. The Bishop assured us and through us, our parishioners, that the funding was obtained basically by mortgaging or selling certain Diocesan properties.

Though no Program can guarantee the behavior of its participants; nonetheless, since 2002, our Diocese has initiated a Safe Environment Office. One of the chief functions of that Office is to vet all Diocesan employees by using various search engines. Similarly the Office organizes and administers the *VIrtus On Line* Program which is obligatory for all Church employees, and volunteers who have any association with children. This means that all bishops, priests, deacons, religious, as well as coaches, assistant coaches, parish athletic directors, teachers, paraprofessionals, drivers, Religious Education employees and volunteers, whether teachers, administrators or class monitors, and all Academy personnel must take the *Virtus Training Programs*. There are no exceptions.
