## SACRAMENTS



Revised Guidelines For Church

- As of the weekend of June 5 – 6, the dispensation from the obligation to attend Mass on Sundays and Holy Days will be lifted. With a view toward achieving 100% occupancy in a safe and responsible way, we are phasing in the following guidelines:
1. The tape will be removed from the pews. We still encouraged all parishioners, especially those who have not been vaccinated, to practice hand hygiene and wear their masks
  2. We will bring back Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion to assist the priests and deacon with the distribution of Holy Communion. The distribution of the Communion Cup will not be available at this time.
  3. We will place Hymnals back in the pews for use by our parishioners.
  4. We will be bringing back Altar Servers in September, but if any Altar Servers wish to serve now they may come to the Sacristy before Mass and make themselves known to the priest and deacon.
  5. Offertory Processions may resume on weekend Masses.
  6. Parishioners are still encouraged to receive Communion in the hand. If anyone wishes to receive Communion on the tongue, they should wait until everyone else has received and only then approach the minister for Holy Communion.
  7. Collections will continue to be taken up by the ushers using long handled baskets.
  8. Holy Water will not be put in the fonts, but has been put in the Holy Water Tank if anyone wishes to take some in their own bottles.

Although the dispensation from the obligation to attend Mass has been lifted, we remind parishioners who are not feeling well to please stay home. We will continue to live stream all the Masses for those who cannot come to Mass or who are not feeling well.

We ask that parishioners please be patient during this time as we seek to return to normal. It will take some time for all of us to re-acquaint ourselves with the “norms” of the liturgy as we had been accustomed.

Dear Parishioners,

At this time of the year the pervasive noises are the sounds of automatic lawnmowers and grass cutters. We are in the growing season and most residents of Forest Hills, who own or rent a home, usually make some effort with the lawn, no matter its size. In a month or two we yearn to see some flowers or vegetables from our efforts. In an urban/suburban setting we struggle to grow flowers or vegetables/fruits in a limited space; yet, in Our Lord's time, farms and fields surrounded Him during His ministry. It should not be a surprise that vineyards, sheepfolds and fields provide the backdrop for many of His parables and teachings. Farm or vineyard workers, estate owners and shepherds often are the featured characters in those parables. Today's Gospel is no exception. This Gospel for the Eleventh Sunday of Ordinary Time is from St. Mark.

There is a profound mystery at the source of the growing process. How and why does something like a small seed, which seems so dead, suddenly begin to sprout? What triggers the transformation? What receptors in the seed respond to the warmth and showers of the springtime? While we have discovered some answers, though incomplete, ancient farmers had not a clue. But they could observe the results. Seed plus water plus sun yielded growth. "...the seed would sprout and grow, he (the farmer) knows not how. Of its own accord the land yields fruit" (Mark 4:26-34). This mysterious growth is compared to the kingdom of the reign of God. It starts small and it needs the cooperation of human beings but the harvest still has a mysterious element.

Our Lord uses a second brief parable to describe the growth of the kingdom of God. Mustard seeds are very small and could easily be confused with a pinch of dust. Yet the mustard seed will produce a rather large shrub. So large, in fact, that it provides space for the nests of many birds. The mustard shrub is not much to look at and it seems strange that Our Lord uses it but He may have wanted to stress that the kingdom of God becomes apparent in the ordinary realities of life. Just as the cooperation of the farmer is necessary for the growth of the shrubs and trees, so are we necessary for the growth of the kingdom. The kingdom is more than heaven; it is also the fulfillment of God's law here on earth. When that fulfillment comes about, we do not know but in the meantime, we have a part in making it happen!

Even the smallest act can influence another person in ways that are incalculable. As a priest I am amazed at what people remember what I might have said in a classroom thirty years ago. Thankfully most of it seems to be positive, which in a way is my paltry contribution to the expansion of God's kingdom. Just recently an upper high school student related that when he was in Our Lady of Mercy Catholic Academy, he remembered have trouble with the wheels of his book bag. I found some WD-40 to spray on them. That very small act of kindness is remembered and perhaps will open other doors for him.

Before 1965, Our Lady of Mercy Parish had no parochial grade school. I am a native of this parish but when I was little, the school was yet to be built so first I attended P.S. #144 (Jeromus Remsen) and then Our Lady, Queen of Martyrs. I clearly remember the kindness of my first grade Religious Education Teacher, whose name I think was a "Mrs. Kelly". Undoubtedly "Mrs. Kelly" long ago went to meet the Lord yet her generosity and kindness are still remembered sixty-eight years later.

Every act of kindness, compassion or generosity extends the kingdom or the reign of God. Building the kingdom is a cooperative venture. In St. Matthew's Gospel we read: "So ask the harvest Master to send out laborers for His harvest." (Matthew 9:38). Our thoughtfulness may not always be reciprocated and there is a temptation to lose hope and patience. But recall what Mother Teresa famously said: "God did not call me to be successful; He called me to be faithful."

No person is unimportant in God's scheme for developing His kingdom. Every kindness counts, each act of generosity or charity is important. Every one of us is God's co-worker and no one is unimportant in the task of building up the Kingdom!

## Annual Catholic Appeal 2021

### How Does Our Parish Benefit?

In order for our parish to function, we need well trained **priests and deacons** who can celebrate the sacraments and administer the parish. Without the **\$2.5 Million** from the Appeal allocated to vocations, we would not have the clergy our parish needs.

Our Children are the future of our parish and we are called to support them as they grow in faith. The Appeal provides funding which supports every parish **religious education program** as well as tuition assistance to those seeking **Catholic Education** at Catholic Academies and Schools. Over **\$2 million** from the Appeal is invested in the faith of our children in addition to also providing **adult faith formation**. Instruction programs for lay people, including those in our own parish, provide training in ministries such as Eucharistic Ministers and Lectors or prepare others for sacraments.

The Appeal also provides the salaries for the trained Youth Ministers working in parishes throughout Brooklyn and Queens. **\$150,000** each year from our donations sustains the **Youth Ministry Initiative**, which has been supported by Generations of Faith, ensuring that young people encounter Christ through the Church, forming life-long bonds of faith which will sustain our parishes for years to come.

Christ Himself has called all of us to care for those among us in need, but as one parish we lack the time, space, skills and volunteers that it takes to address the needs of our brothers and sisters who need our help. This is why, through the Annual Catholic Appeal, our parish supports the work of **Catholic Charities** and **Catholic Migration Services** which receive a total of **\$1.4 million** from the Appeal. Together we are able to welcome the stranger, clothe the naked, feed the hungry and shelter the homeless in the name of our Church.

In our efforts to spread the Gospel of Christ we also have a responsibility as Catholics to minister to those who are ill, students in high schools and colleges as well as those who are imprisoned, just as Christ directed us to. The Appeal provides **\$1.9 million** to ensure that **chaplains** bring the sacraments of the church to those who are ill, imprisoned or are studying in high school and college.

### **Why is my participation important?**

As followers of Jesus here at Our Lady of Mercy, we understand our responsibility to our parish implies a responsibility to the diocese which unites us together with the entire Catholic community as the one body of Christ.

When one part of the body does not participate, the entire body suffers and makes it harder to function. Likewise, your participation in this Appeal, over and above your regular Sunday offering, will determine the ability of Our Lady of Mercy to faithfully support the mission of Christ while also providing the needed support we receive as one parish, which is part of the larger Catholic Church.


